- 2. Life members were recognized, and then the explanation of the differences in the types of membership (annual, life, and emeritus) were explained.
- 3. A new form is needed each year to keep the contact information in the database up to date. We no longer mail anything out, so email addresses must be current keep members informed of what is happening within the organization.
- 4. Unit reps were asked to stand so everyone attending could identify who they were. We would like to have a rep for each MG unit. Wanda is trying to reach out to several units without reps to recruit one.
- 5. The membership recruitment boards are complete and brochures have been printed to help us gain new members.
- 6. VMGA offers an annual education event and members receive a discounted rate for attending. It was suggested that members could send a copy of their membership card with the registration forms.

Merchandise Sales:

The current VMGA budget includes a line item for projected income received from MG Gear sales. The current budget calls for \$3600 in gross sales. To date the gross sales of MG Gear is \$4718.10. The net income from our sales goes directly to the VMGA Endowment Fund. As of today, our net income (gross sales – cost of goods) is \$1270.95. We have added ball caps and new colors to merchandise inventory, are working with new vendors that have better prices. Our inventory was confirmed by the Audit Review Team.

"On-line" sales:

We have implemented new merchandise ordering procedures and developed a new on-line ordering system/procedure. From VMGA.net homepage click on the MG Gear tab. From that page click on the sales@vmga.net, this will generate an email form. Your email will go to Jennifer and me. We will work with you directly to fulfill your order then send a link to a payment page. We are hoping to refine this process in time.

Williamsburg Graphics updates:

- 1. At our last meeting, I reported that JCCW MGA offered to give us the proceeds from their sales of the December misprinted inventory. To date, they have given us \$720. I asked Joe Kelley to send a letter to the President of JCCW MGA to express our sincere thanks. I know I am grateful beyond words.
- 2. I received approval to spend the \$250 donation from Angela Cingale. This was a technicality.
- 3. The process to recover our funds via Sun Trust's Fraud Division did not pan out.
- 4. We chose not to pursue placing a lien on the properties of Stephen Tyler, owner of the now defunct Williamsburg Graphics.

VMGA Endowment Team

- 1. Live auction and donations at 2016 College resulted in \$2810 because the live auction was a hit. Thanks to Angela Cingale and her remarkable team.
- 2. CALS Development mailed solicitation (to 4107 households) that resulted in \$7839.00 in donations (from 118 donors).

The cash account balance is \$283,985 an increase of \$1507 since the April report. Over the same period, the market value has increased \$12,601 to \$360,333. Outstanding pledges are at \$950 and the amount of deferred commitments stands at \$233,386. This table shows the current balances and those of the last several years:

Since the April meeting, we received notice that Ben Grove, our liaison to CALS Development, has accepted another position within the university. We wish Ben all the best. We have not learned of a replacement, and are hoping CALS leadership moves quickly to fill the position. Someone asked how we invested the endowment money and Pat explained that VT does the investing, and that we do not. She asked that units offer to host meetings where the fundraising team could explain the endowment which would erase a lot of questions that many Master Gardeners have.

MG College Auction/Silent Auction Team:

- We held a live auction rather than a silent auction at MG College 2016. Proceeds from that and other donations totaled \$2810.00.
- 2. The auction team set a goal to lessen the time of auction set up and checkout. Toward that goal, the auction team has minimized the number of items in the auction. To see that unit/association baskets realize bids closer to their value, the team has asked that local items are bundled in groups with values in the \$25 \$35 range. The team solicited specific items rather than multiple, broadcast requests for items, and is receiving more plants and garden/horticultural items.
- 3. Timing was changed as well, with the closing of bidding at the end of the afternoon break on Saturday. The close out team will be treated to dinner as checkout is prepared during the time between the final general session and the VMGA annual meeting, 4:30 6:30pm. Payment for items will begin at 8pm as the VMGA reception takes place.
- 4. The team welcomes all suggestions and offers of assistance. We thank everyone for their generous contributions and for bidding on items.

Considering all that we've been through since December, our fundraising efforts for the past year have been excellent.

Since the format of how we ran this year's silent auction was different than prior years, Pat Reilly reported that the profits for this year's silent auction is \$2,269.00.
